## Starting School in September 2025?

Your child must be in full-time education at the beginning of the term following his or her fifth birthday. If your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 they are due to start primary school in September 2025. Applications for starting primary school in September 2025 opened on **15<sup>th</sup> November 2024** and close on 15 January 2025.

The date that all allocations of school places are announced in England is known as 'Offer day'. For September 2025 primary school starters this will be on 16 April 2025. Apply for your child's place on the Devon Citizen Portal (link below).
